The cost is \$5 per academic year for students. Faculty may join at no charge.

Basic Guidelines

Discounted tickets are subject to availability and are limited to one ticket per student registrant. Students must be registered in the program to receive discounted tickets for Ford Center-sponsored events.

Discounted tickets may be purchased at any time prior to the date of the performance for performances taking place during the membership term.

Participants may be required to present both their cultural passport and University of Mississippi ID to take advantage of program benefits. Cultural passports must be renewed each academic year.

Lost passports will be replaced for a fee of \$5.
